

#### **GMC SFTP Annual data collection**


- Every year medical schools submit their student fitness to practise cases from the past academic year
- This was part of the Medical School Annual Returns (MSARs) until 2016/17 and has now been integrated with our Registration team collection known as the UK Scheme
  - Row by row data on student fitness to practise cases
  - Data is self-reported and not independently verified by the GMC
- Data on closed cases used to compile the annual student fitness to practise report, circulated to all medical schools

### Annual student fitness to practise report


- The report is built from the following information in the school submissions:
  - Stage the concern reached (identified; pastoral care and support; investigation; committee / panel)
  - Year of study
  - Entry method (standard vs. graduate entry)
  - Gender
  - Ethnicity
  - Type of concern (e.g. conduct, health, caution or conviction); optional to include whether health cases related to physical or mental health
  - Case outcome

#### 2016/17 Report: Stage of process reached



### 2016/17 Report: Cases by year of study and stage of process




#### 2016/17 Report: Nature of concern






# Interesting observations (1): Outcomes by entry method (standard vs. graduate entry)
